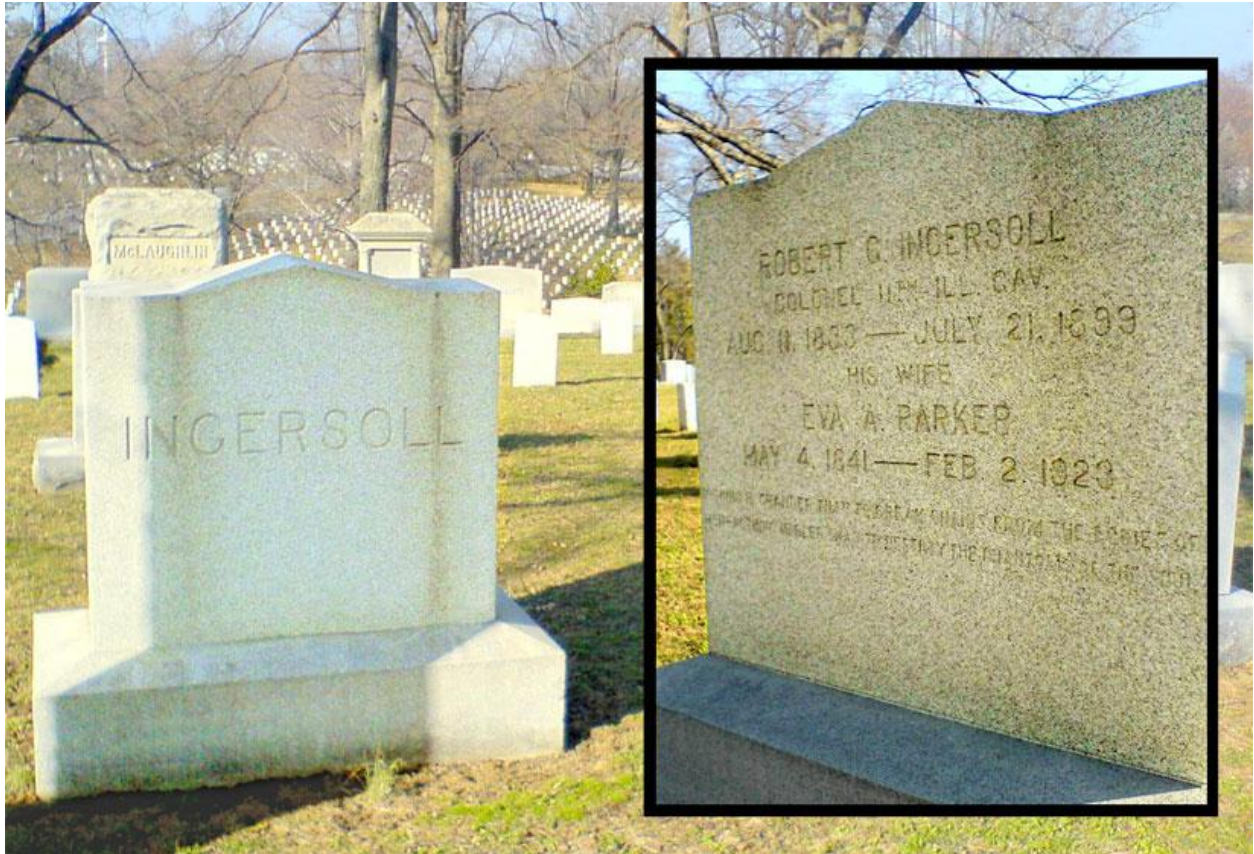


Photo 35 Ingersoll tombstone – South Section 3 # 1620
